Heritage Day 2024: William Hall

William Hall was the son of formerly enslaved parents, Jacob and Lucy who fled Maryland during the War of 1812 as refugees and settled in Nova Scotia. He enlisted in the Royal Navy in 1852 and received the Victoria Cross for his "gallant conduct" during his service.
